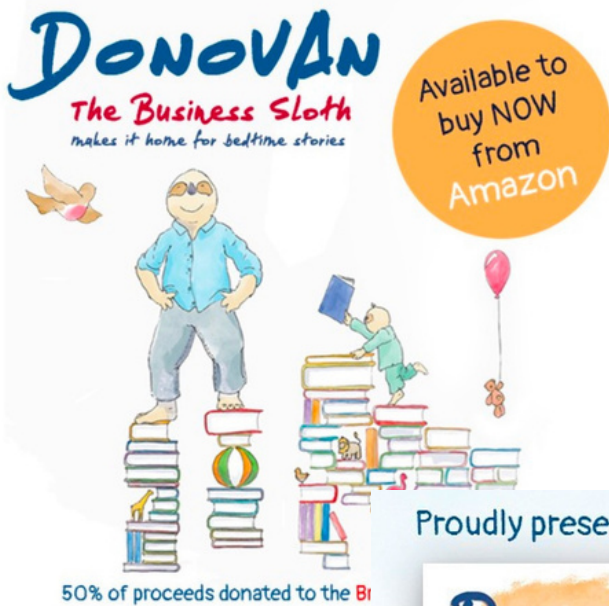
Isabella and Rory were awarded a distinction and merit at Entry Level 3 in Speaking Verse and Prose from the London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art.

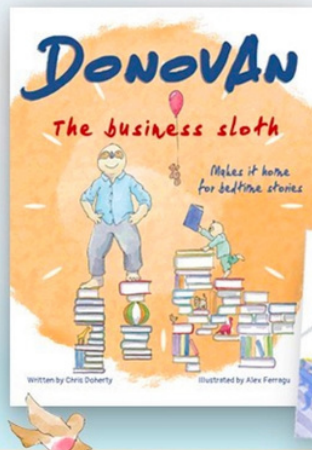
